Alternative Energy Division off to a flying start

The alternative energy division are off to an impressive start having recently been commissioned to complete one of its largest projects to date.

Mike Bergstrom, General Manager, tells us more, "The client identified some faults in the material used to manufacture their wind turbines, which largely affected the gearbox of the turbine.

In order to rectify the construction deficiencies in up to 500 units and return the turbines to full service they asked BIS Salamis Inc. to complete the rigging and removal of the entire faulty gear box in each unit, at site and replace it with a new one.

"This sizeable project will provide the recently created alternative energy division with an opportunity to showcase the vast range of services they have developed to meet the needs of the market place.

"This includes the provision of: Bolt Tensioning and Torque Checks, Brake Pad Check, Air Filters, Crack Inspections of Coupler and Blades, Fluid Level Checks, Greasing, Electrical Maintenance and Inspection Services.

Mike went on to provide us with more detail on the project, "With some turbines reaching 300 feet tall and the gearbox weighing an impressive 20 tonnes, we will be utilizing one of the worlds' largest mobile cranes and, in some cases a 2 ton fixture -



one of only three in the world - to move the gearbox and hold the rotor in place.

"Once a full inspection of the gearbox has been completed and its performance is deemed satisfactory, the generator will be aligned with a tolerance of $\pm 7.5 \mu\text{m}$. Once aligned, the components will be torqued down to the highest value of 2100N-m (1,500ft-lbs), the online computer will be set for the new gearbox and 70 gallons of new oil will be added to the wind turbine.

"This will return the turbine to full operating capacity enabling it to produce 1.6MW on just 29mph winds.

"We are confident in our ability to deliver on this project and with the support of our competent personnel, are determined to meet our clients' expectations."
